

Prevalence of Treatment Resistance in Schizophrenia

- 392 never-treated patients with schizophrenia
- Remission rates during treatment follow-up
- > 90% used 2nd gen antipsychotic medications first line
- 14% never met any remission criteria



Burden of Treatment Resistance

- High rate of smoking (56%)
- High rate of alcohol abuse (51%) and substance abuse (51%)

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
- High rate of suicidal ideation (44%)
- Quality of life 20% lower
- Healthcare costs 3 11 times higher



Antipsychotic Medication Comparative Effectiveness

- Odds of treatment failure compared with oral olanzapine



- 244 patients
- First episode schizophrenia
- Medication algorithm
 - Trials 1&2: risperidone or olanzapine
 - Trial 3: clozapine




Treatment Guidelines

- Patients with schizophrenia are appropriate for clozapine when
 - <u>treatment-resistant</u>: significant symptoms despite trials of two other antipsychotic medications
 - <u>risk for suicide</u> attempts or suicide remains substantial despite other treatments
 - <u>risk for aggressive behavior</u> remains substantial despite other treatments




CSS-SMI GRANT GOALS



Data as of 4/2/19 at 4:00AM






Current Activities

 - solo practitioners, clinics, agencies, hospitals, chronic care facilities
